


**NEBC Student Travel Grants
for “Away” Meeting
Woods Hole, MA
14-16 September 2018**

The New England Botanical Club is pleased to offer Student Travel Grants, intended to provide funds for several students to attend an annual NEBC “Away” Meeting. The grant this year is to attend the “away” meeting with the Botanical Club of Cape Cod and the Islands at Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution from September 14 to September 16.


This experience is an opportunity for both educational and professional development, allowing students to gain field experience in the identification of native flora and ecosystems, while presenting the opportunity to make contacts with leaders of the botanical community in the northeastern United States.

The grant (\$125.) will help cover the registration fee, some meals, and lodging at the rate available to club members participating in the trip. Consideration will also be given for travel support and car-pooling.

The grant is open to undergraduate and graduate students enrolled at least half-time at a New England college or university. Membership in NEBC is not required. Eligible students should have an interest in the flora of North America, particularly New England and adjacent areas. The grant recipients are expected to participate fully in all aspects of the “away” meeting and field trips.

Students interested in receiving a NEBC Student Travel Grant must:

- **Request early, as grants will be made “first come, first served”**
- **Send an email to President@rhodora.org Subject Line: Travel Grant**
- **Write in the email a short statement about yourself and your reason for wanting to attend this “away” meeting**
- **Give in the email, your name, address, telephone (indicate cell, if applicable), preferred email address, school, and major**
- **If chosen, complete a registration form immediately (31 Aug 2018 deadline).**
