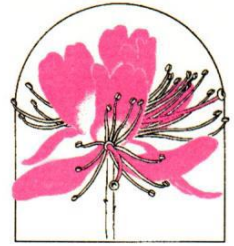

Directions to UVM Campus and Jeffords Hall

From points south, take I-89 to Burlington, Vermont. Get off the highway at exit 14 W and head west on Route 2 (Main Street), towards Burlington. Go through four sets of lights. Immediately after the fourth set, look on the right for Beaumont Avenue, which will take you into the UVM campus. Take your first left off Beaumont, which will put you in the parking lot of Jeffords Hall, a large red brick edifice. [The big blue water tower is a good landmark: building sits just across Carrigan Drive from the tower.] Visitor parking is close to the building, at the south end.

On the UVM map below, Jeffords Hall is circled in purple and the Jeffords parking lot is nearby. Payment is required for this lot from 7:00 am to 6:00 pm, Monday-Friday, using the ParkMobile app. Please note that North is to the left in the map.

Pringle Herbarium Tour - 3:00-4:00 PM

Meet Dr. David Barrington in the foyer just inside the main E entrance to Jeffords Hall.

Tour Goals: I will give an introduction to the collection while opening up cabinets and displaying the contents. I'll include the general features of the collection, including size of the whole collection and its components, geographic coverage, and short biographies of significant collectors beginning with Pringle himself. I will also show some of the more unusual collections that we have kept separate, including the oldest set of collections made here in Vermont (1813-15) and a unique and important collection of fungi stored in small boxes for various sundries saved from the collector Charles Frost's day job as a shoemaker. I'll also talk a little about current research with the collection, which as you might imagine is heavily weighted towards fern systematics.

From the South:

Head northeast on I-89 N toward Exit 6

Take exit 14W for US-2 W toward Burlington [0.2 mi]

Merge onto US-2/Williston Rd Continue to follow US-2 [1.2 mi]

Continue on Main St. [0.4 mi]

Turn right at St. Paul St. [361 ft]
