


**NEBC Student Travel Grants

The New England Botanical Club is pleased to offer a Student Travel Grant, intended to provide funds for several students to attend an annual NEBC “Away” Meeting. The grant this fall is to attend the “Away” meeting in Dorchester, NH, at D Acres of New Hampshire – Permaculture Farm & Educational Homestead, from September 6-7.


This experience is an opportunity for both educational and professional development, allowing students to gain field experience in the identification of native flora and ecosystems, while presenting the opportunity to make contacts with leaders of the botanical community in the northeastern United States.

The grant includes the meeting registration fee at the rate available to club members participating in the trip, as well as part of other travel expenses.

The grant is open to undergraduate and graduate students enrolled at least half-time at a New England college or university. Membership in NEBC is not required. Eligible students should have an interest in the flora of North America, particularly New England and adjacent areas. The grant recipients are expected to participate fully in all aspects of the “Away” Meeting.

Students interested in receiving a NEBC Student Travel Grant must:

- **Request early, as grants will be made “first come, first served”**
- **Send an email to nebc@rhodora.org Subject Line: Travel Grant**
- **Write in the email a short statement about yourself and your reason for wanting to attend this “away” meeting**
- **Give in the email your name, address, telephone (indicate cell, if applicable), preferred email address, school, and major**
- **If chosen, complete a registration form immediately. The \$100 travel grant is meant to cover registration, meals, and some lodging and travel expenses.**
