"Two Tales of Floristic Change in Southern New England: Orchids and Northern Species"

- 2) DR. BERTIN'S ABSTRACT: Floras change over time in response to numerous variables, including land use changes, species introductions, climate change, and other factors. This talk will examine and attempt to explain changes in frequencies of two groups of plants in southern New England: orchids and northern species (i.e., those near the southern end of their range). It will include a discussion of different data sources and their limitations and the challenges of dealing with potentially confounding factors.
