Away Meeting - June 8-10, 2013
Northwestern Vermont – the Shores of Lake Champlain

Join the NEBC for an exciting late spring botanical foray and meeting in northwestern Vermont, June 8-10!

Saturday June 8 - 12:30 PM – Field Trip to Missisquoi National Wildlife Refuge, led by Art Gilman (former NEBC President). Art is a renowned botanist, expert in the Ophioglossaceae, and author of the new Flora of Vermont. We will explore easy walking trails and see some of the Midwestern species that are New England rarities.

Saturday June 8 – 7 PM – Lecture at UVM’s Jeffords Hall by Dr. Charles V. Cogbill, well-known plant ecologist, forest historian and author. Dr. Cogbill will enlighten and entertain the Club with a talk on the Presettlement Forests of New England. The evening will, of course, include refreshments and an opportunity to socialize with fellow native plant enthusiasts. (There is no registration fee for the lecture, but we would appreciate your pre-registration).

Sunday June 9 – 9 AM – Field trip to Kingsland Bay State Park in Ferrisburg led by Bob Popp, Botanist with the Vermont Fish and Wildlife Division, Natural Heritage Inventory, to seek out rare calcareous flora.

Monday, June 10 – 9 AM – Special trip to Cady’s Falls Nursery in Morrisville, run by fern enthusiast Don Avery. Check their website!
