

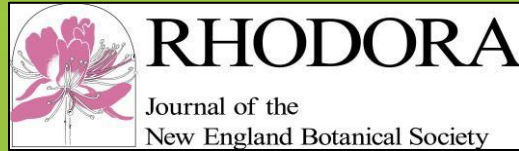

Our **monthly meetings** are open to the public and feature presentations that cover a wide range of subjects including seed plants, mosses, algae, lichens, fungi, and plant specimens. They cover a wide range of topics including conservation of rare plants, ecology, invasive species, seed banking, taxonomy, plant genetics, and paleobotany. Speakers are from a wide range of positions, including academia, plant societies, botanical gardens, government organizations, herbaria, and more. Some meetings are virtual or hybrid; recordings are usually available.

The NEBS herbaria (acronym NEBC), contain over 360,000 specimens- the largest collections for New England! They are stored with the Harvard University Herbaria at 22 Divinity Avenue, Cambridge, MA. We are actively growing the herbarium to incorporate modern collections!

Membership to NEBS includes electronic and print copies of our peer-reviewed journal *Rhodora*, a high-quality publication devoted primarily to the botany of North America. The *Rhodora* editorial staff accept scientific papers and notes relating to systematics, floristics, ecology, evolution, biogeography, population genetics, paleobotany, or conservation biology.
